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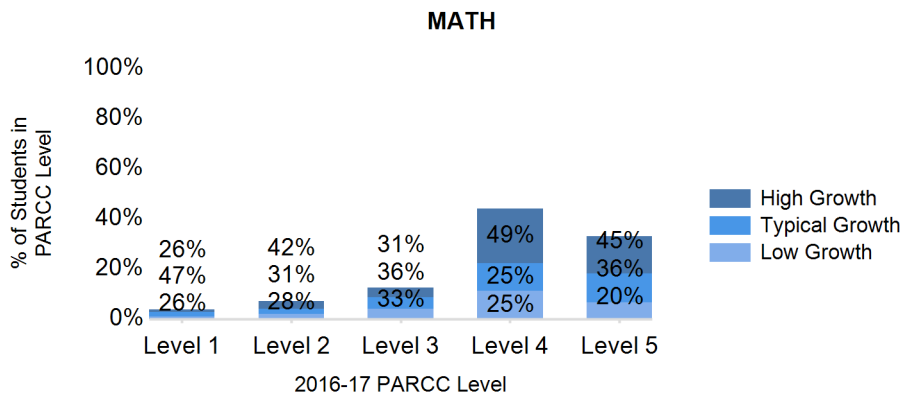
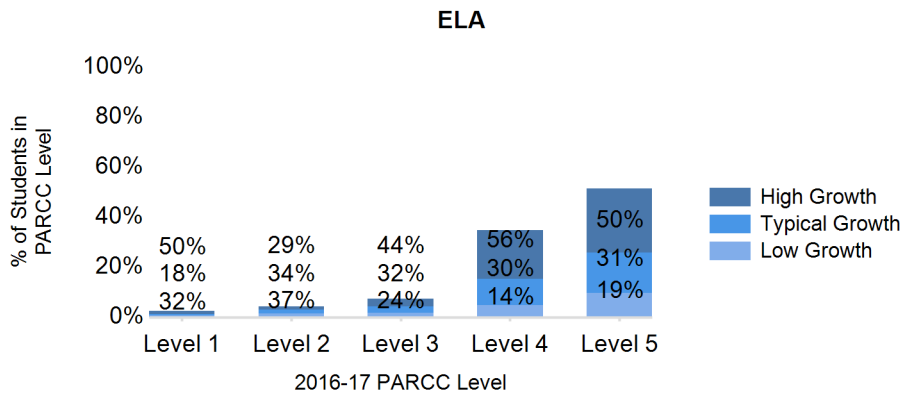

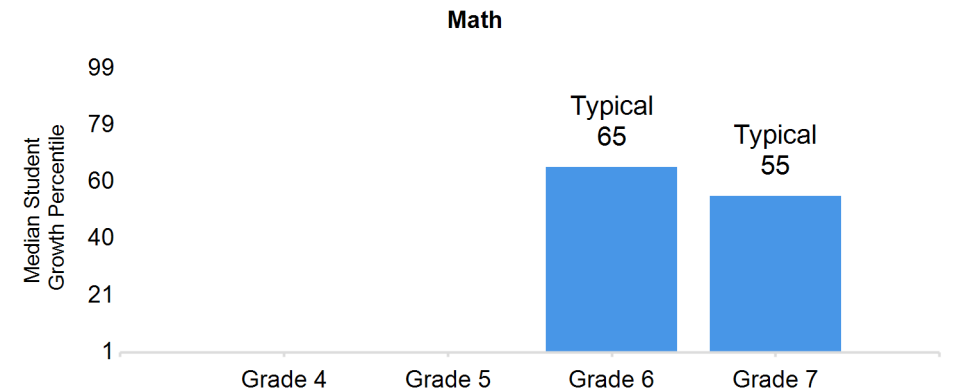
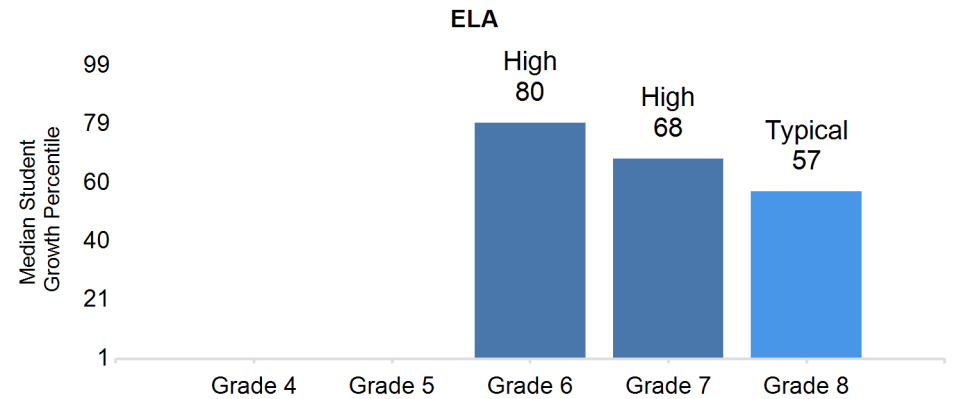
**Student Growth by Performance Level**

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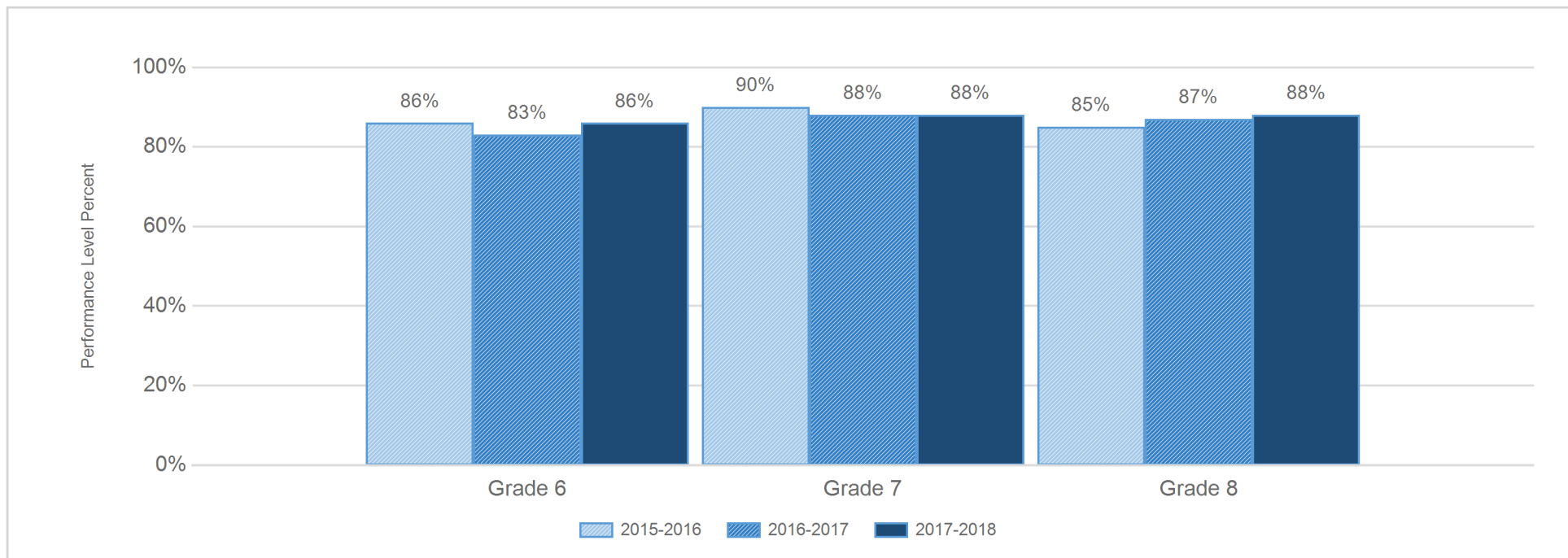

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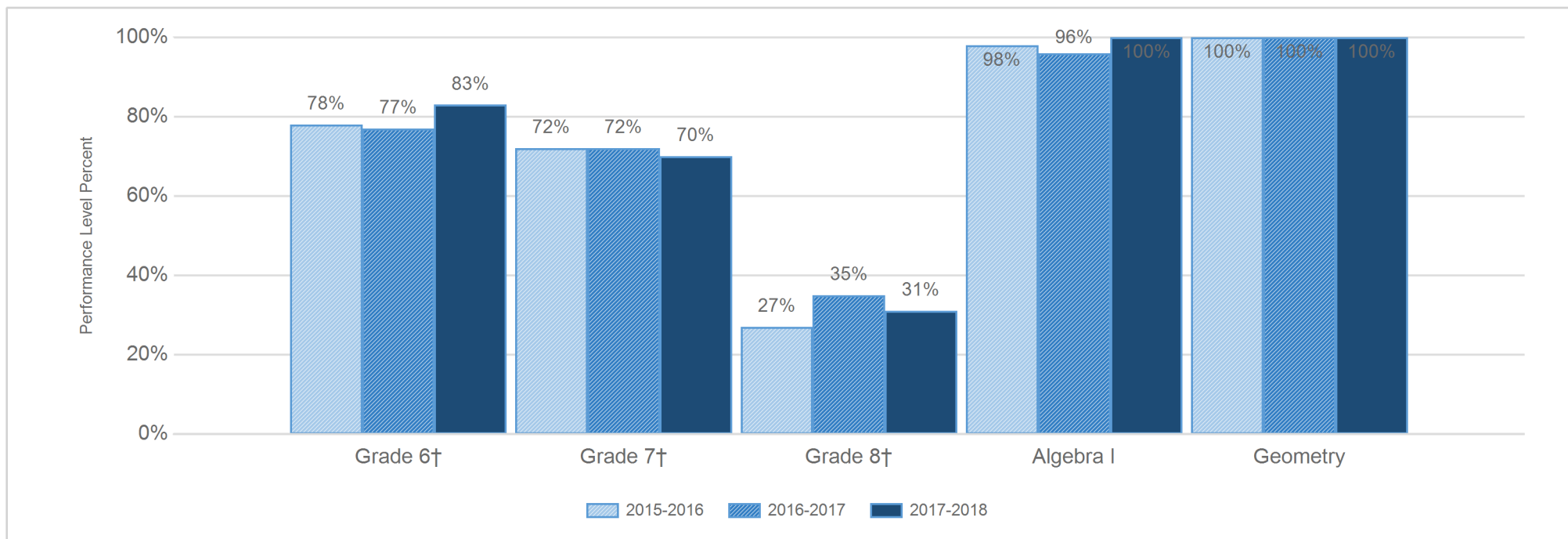

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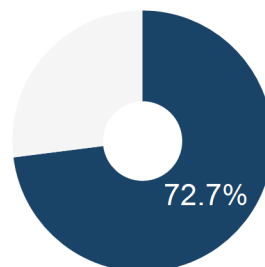

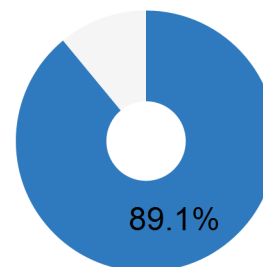

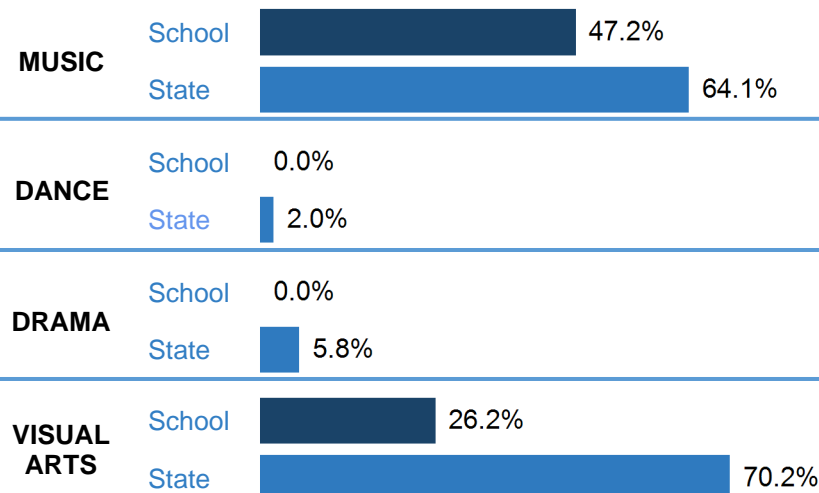

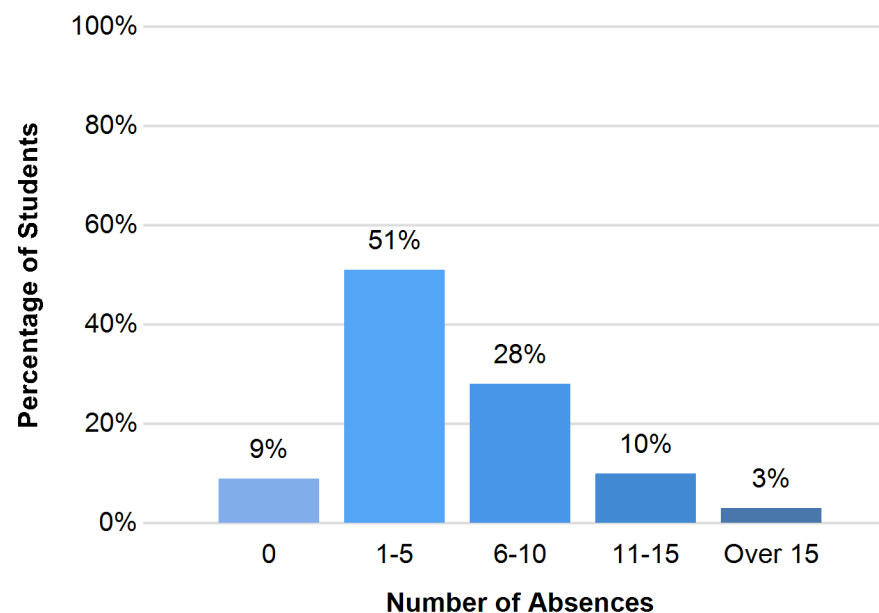

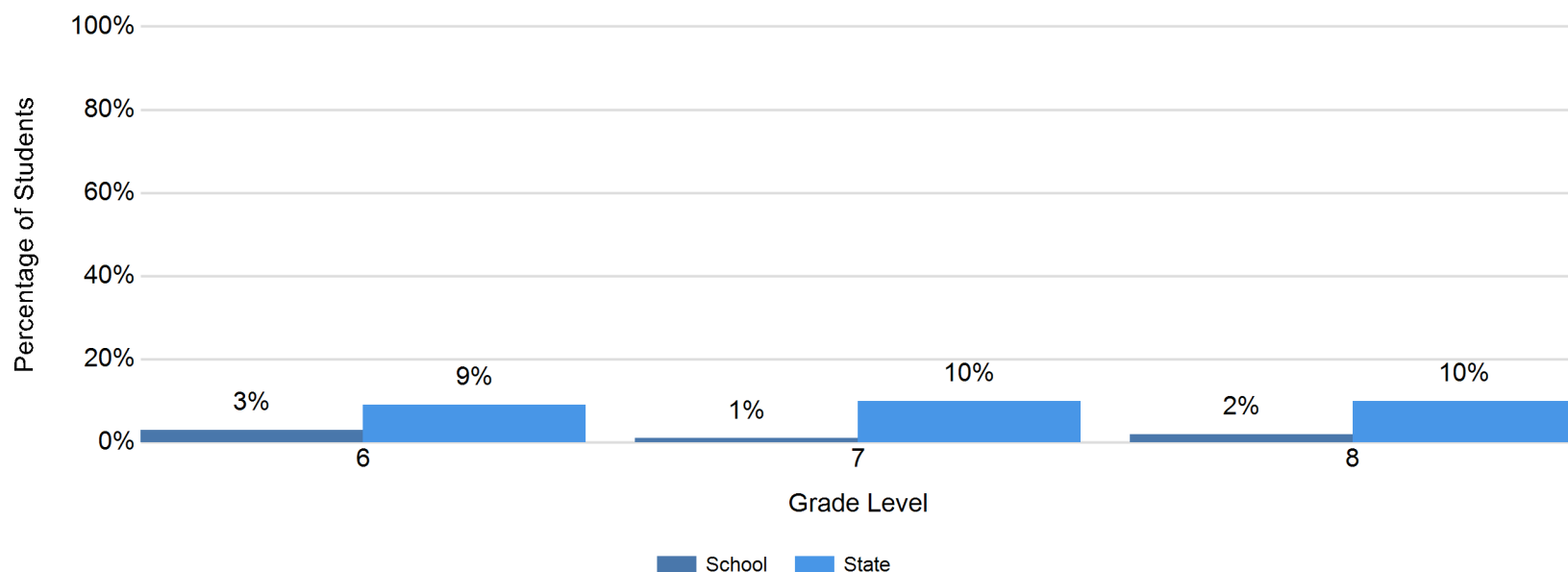

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Courses, Curriculum,  
Instruction:

We are in the third year of a one-to-one technology initiative. We assess student progress through a diagnostic test three times during the year and there are benchmark assessments administered quarterly in academic content areas. Students have access to an interactive textbook in their math, science and social studies classes. By the end of grade 8, over 90% of students have successfully completed Algebra 1.



Sports and Athletics:
