# XI. COMMITTEE REPORTS

# 1. <u>Curriculum/Technology Committee</u>

Mrs. Anes reported that the committee met September 21, 2011.

In attendance: Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Veena Iyer, Dr. Frank Heelan, Mr. Gene I. Maeroff, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Ms. Margaret DeLuca and Mrs. AnnMarie Griffin-Ussak

# Parent Notification Letter NCLB

Dr. O'Malley reviewed parent letter mandated under NCLB to be sent to parents of students attending Title I schools reviewing the highly qualified status of our teachers. He noted that all of Edison's teaching staff satisfy the highly qualified definition. He also reviewed Board Policy 2415.04 Title I District-Wide Parental Involvement. It is required that this policy be reviewed annually.

# Pre K through 5

- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak reviewed the implementation of the Journey's Professional Development. Working with the publisher arrangements have been made to provide teachers with support throughout the school year.
- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak provided an overview of the Singapore Math Pilot. There are currently 21 teachers throughout the District who have volunteered to pilot this program. They cover a variety of grade levels. Professional Development will be provided for the teachers, for which the District has paid, and the materials have been provided at no cost.
- Mr. Maeroff expressed that while he supports the program, he has concern that Singapore
  Math is so different from our current practice, that a pilot may not provide a fair measure of
  its value.
- Mrs. Griffin-Ussak confirmed that with the ongoing professional development, the teachers would be comfortable and knowledgeable in the instructional methodologies and strategies.
- Writing instruction in the elementary schools will be supported using a district-wide calendar
  of assignments to assure consistency and focus. Mrs. Griffin-Ussak has worked with the
  building principals to develop the schedule which has been distributed to all teachers.
- A full presentation of the NJASK 3-5 results will be made at the October 5<sup>th</sup> Caucus meeting.
   Preliminary data on district-wide proficiency was reviewed for each grade level. Math total
   proficiency was stronger than that in Language Arts. Concern was expressed for subgroups
   that were underperforming.
- As a result of unusually high class size at Benjamin Franklin Elementary School, an additional
  4<sup>th</sup> grade class was created by modifying the Read 180 program. Staff and students have been
  assigned.
- NWEA (3 through 8)
- Ms. DeLuca provided an update on the NWEA testing, which had begun on September 16<sup>th</sup> in four schools. She reported that other than some technological difficulties, but beyond that the testing was going well. Dr. O'Malley was scheduled to address the Lindeneau Elementary School (September 27<sup>th</sup>) and Benjamin Franklin Elementary School (October 4<sup>th</sup>) staff to review student results and Ms. DeLuca will be going to Thomas Jefferson Middle School (October 11<sup>th</sup>) and John Adams Middle School (October 13<sup>th</sup>).

## Middle Schools

- The middle school principals will be selecting teacher committee members to participate in a review of the middle school schedule. All principals would like to see the implementation of a block schedule to expand instructional time in mathematics. The committee members will visit several school districts which have different types of block schedules to discuss the impact on students and staff. The plan is to have a recommendation in place by December, so that professional development can be provided for teaching in an extended period of time.
- The math supervisors are currently studying the change in math sequence to enable qualified students to take Algebra 1 as 7<sup>th</sup> grade and Geometry in 8<sup>th</sup> grade. They are reviewing the impact on staff, resources, current offering of advanced math at the high school level and how to transition the change into our schools.

### High Schools

- The Algebra 1 iPad pilot has begun. A press conference was held on September 12<sup>th</sup>. Students using the iPads and control groups have taken a survey measuring their attitude in math, as well as an Algebra Pre-test. The attitude survey and a post test will be administered at the end of the year.
- More than 4,000 people have submitted forms for access to the parent portal. Their information is being input and their documentation sent to them.
- The Standards Solutions program for Math and Language Arts at Edison High School has begun. The first meeting was very well received by the teachers. The Math program at John P. Stevens High School has also begun.
- Edison High School was accepted by the College Board to have 9<sup>th</sup> grade students test at no cost to the District. Since we had already committed to testing all 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> grade students, we decided to test 9<sup>th</sup> grade students at John P. Stevens High School students as well. A letter was sent to parents advising them that October 12<sup>th</sup> would be a delayed opening for seniors to allow for the PSAT administration for grades 9-11 at both high schools.
- Acceptance into the National Honor Society has been moved to the fall. This will enable seniors, who qualify, to put their membership on their college applications. The principals and honor society advisors met with Ms. DeLuca to develop a timeline and common forms. The Leadership component has caused some confusion. A new form was developed which will enable teachers to comment specifically on a student's leadership ability, even if he/she is not a club president. The qualifications are consistent with the national by-laws.
- The Study Hall Review Committee was being formed with teacher, counselor, student, parent and Board member participation. It should meet for the first time in early October and will have a recommendation to the Board by December.

#### Technology

• Dr. O'Malley reviewed the status of various technology initiatives. He spoke about the addition to the District's Dashboard on the website, which now showed a breakdown of course enrollments at the high school level.

# 2. <u>Finance/Facilities Committee</u>

Dr. Heelan reported that the committee met September 27, 2011 at Edison High School.

In attendance: Dr. Frank Heelan, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Theresa Ward, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Paul Jenney, Jr., Mr. Charles Ross, Ms. Jannette Ball and Thomas C. Rienzi

#### Discussion

- Mr. Ross, Edison High School Principal, gave an overview of the needs for additional
  classrooms to accommodate an expanding student enrollment of Edison High School and
  the increasing demand for science electives. Currently, there are five full-size science
  labs and two other classrooms associated with science prep. Potential science offerings
  encompass advanced placement science courses and electives for forensics,
  anatomy/physiology, biomedical ethics and environmental studies.
- Four more science labs with associated prep space are required for Edison High School. Ten additional classrooms are needed for related real world application fields, such as electronics, engineering, media, technology and nursing. Mr. Ross also envisions a large group instruction mini-theater with approximately 80 seats, so students could be provided with structured courses in a college-like environment.
- Mr. Ross used Google maps to demonstrate how residential developments have hemmed in Edison High School, as compared to Piscataway, East Brunswick and South Brunswick High Schools. Where could we possibly build the equivalent of 20 classrooms to handle current and future needs of Edison High School students?
- Mr. Ross delineated four potential sites that would meet the spatial requirements: construct a 2<sup>nd</sup> floor about the World Language Wing, Preston Street fields, courtyards, or the teacher parking lot to the east of Edison High School. The first three alternatives were not feasible due to the hazards of construction over existing buildings, the retention of recreational space for tennis courts, and the requirement of maintaining twenty feet from existing buildings.
- There was general consensus among those in attendance that the teachers' parking, adjacent to the current science labs, would be the most practical site to construct the classrooms. This site fulfills the spatial requirements for the classrooms and a connecting corridor would facilitate direct access to the existing science labs. Moreover, the location for construction affords minimal disturbance of the regular educational program for students in Edison High School.
- Mr. Rienzi was requested to prepare a cost-feasible proposal with architectural drawings that would be presented to the Finance and Facilities Committee, and subsequently, to the Edison Board of Education.

She mentioned that parking is a problem at John P. Stevens High School and discussed the Tikan Charter School \$200,000 federal grant.

Emil Ferlicchi, ETEA President, responded to the Finance and Facility Committee report. He asked about the cost for this project and for a timetable.

Matt Hrevnak, Teacher, asked if there was a math program committee. He commented on the Curriculum and Technology report and PSAT optional costs.

Melissa Boxer, resident, said that she has a problem with a Dapper Bus traveling on Route 287. She felt the 7:45 A.M. bus stop is too early and felt the substitute bus drivers do not know where they are going. Ms. Boxer also mentioned that the driver used foul language to the students.
