IX. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Finance/Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Committee met on August 16, 2012 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Veena Iyer, Mrs. Theresa A. Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud and Mr. Peter Campisano from USA Architects

Discussion:

- The Long Range Facility Plan will be completed by the end of September, a month tardy due to a website data transfer.
- We await the keys for the Edison Primary School; Keys must be received by the end of September to affect a September 2013 opening.
- Substantial completion of the boiler upgrades at John P. Stevens High School is expected prior to the opening of school; Gymnasium partitions at the five designated schools are scheduled to be completed by September 1st, with the exception of the doors; Catch basins are being installed on Garden Street for the Lindeneau Elementary School drainage system and concrete work for sidewalks is being completed on Blossom Street; Concrete and tile work for Herbert Hoover Middle School and tile work and fixtures for the John Marshall Elementary School will be completed shortly; Pipes and stone work have been installed for the synthetic turf field at Edison High School and the synthetic turf itself is ready to be laid on the field; For the turf field at John P. Stevens High School, we are waiting for written confirmation from the DEP that a permit is not required; Plans for the science wing at Edison High School are moving forward for bidding and awarded in October, with science classrooms being expanded to 1,200 square feet and sprinklers being added to comply with state code regulations.
- The Edison maintenance crew is working on the interior alterations for the Lincoln Elementary School library and they are busily completing their other summer projects.
- The Taxpayers' Guide to Education Spending (July 2012) was analyzed by the committee.

- The impact of Edison Township municipal overload due to property reduction assessments on the Edison School District was reviewed. \$16.5 million has to be paid out in 2012 to mostly commercial and industrial businesses as well as residential associations. In 2011, the Town bonded \$5 million over five years to pay for successful tax appeals. With the Town seeking to borrow more than three times that amount to pay for the tax appeals, what will be the effect on the School District in requesting homeowners/voters to approve a budget for education?
- Business Administrator, Daniel Michaud, reviewed the cash flow of the School District at this point in time.

The next meeting the Finance/Facilities Committee will be held on Tuesday, September 4, 2012 at 11:00 A.M. at the Education Center.

2. Curriculum Committee

Mrs. Anes reported that the Curriculum Committee met on August 20, 2012 at the Education Center.

Discussion:

- RTI Response to Intervention is a structure to ensure student achievement. It will provide equity in the use of materials and human resources based on student need throughout the district. All students will be administered a universal screener to determine their specific need. Students will be monitored closely to determine progress through their specific need. Students will be monitored closely to determine progress through the interventions in place. Math interventionists, Literacy interventionists and reading specialists will provide support for students in both a push-in and pull-out model based on student need. Student Response Teams (SRT) in each school will monitor student growth and adjust intervention plans based on analysis of data collected.
- Textbook Approval
 - Spanish Grades 1-2 and Grades 3-5 Two books were selected for use in the Elementary Spanish program <u>Superdrago</u> (3-5) and <u>Risas Y Sonrisas</u> (1-2)
 - Food and Nutrition Family and Consumer Science text for middle schools.
- Curriculum Approval The following curricula guides have been revised to align our courses with State and Common Core standards;
 - Science
 - Grade 6 and Grade 8
 - Environmental 1, Level 2

The changeover to Google mail and an improved filter is also complete.

Jeff Bowden, ETEA President, thanked the Board and Dr. O'Malley for settling a child care leave grievance.
