1. Finance & Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the committee met January 17, 2012 at the Education Center

In attendance were Mrs. Deborah Anes, Mrs. Theresa Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Mr. Gene Maeroff, Mr. Daniel Michaud and Dr. Richard O'Malley

Discussion

- The preliminary budget for 2012-2013 was reviewed with an eye towards keeping the local tax rate below two percent.
- A closer inspection of the Kilmer project indicates the need for a roof, costing in the area of \$750,000. For the purpose of the Kilmer building and other capital improvement projects, the \$1.5 million will be transferred from extraordinary aid to capital reserve.
- The plan for USA projects was reviewed, including the Camp Kilmer building, the new boiler at John P. Stevens High School (Strunk-Albert Engineers), the gymnasium partitions at various schools, Lindeneau Elementary School drainage upgrades, John Marshall Elementary School lavatories, and the Herbert Hoover Middle School floor upgrade for room 117.
- Employee benefits, costs and renewals for 2012-2013 were reviewed as proposed by representative, Joseph Columbo, from GR Murray. Several plan options with variable percentages are being analyzed and considered for implementation by 7/1/12.
- A "Safe Route to School" grant application has been filed for \$77,873 that requests curbs for John Marshall, Menlo Park and James Monroe Elementary Schools.
- The total cost for subscription bussing for 1,500 students is close to \$700,000, so the cost set for 2012-13 will be the same as the cost for 2011-12 or \$475 per student.
- New Jersey was awarded \$38 million for the "Race to the Top" and the administration will investigate any potential funding for the district.
- NJ Edge involves funding for the virtualization of servers so as to eliminate servers for back-up memory. Bill McSorley will consider applying for this funding as part of our disaster recovery plan.
- The next meeting of the Finance and Facilities Committee will meet February 15, 2012 at 9:30 A.M. in the Education Center.
