Mrs. Iyer read the following opening statement:

"The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on March 31, 2014.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

IV. <u>RECOGNITION</u>

- Mrs. Iyer presented the "I Am Edison Public School" video, recognizing "Hidden Hero" Board of Education Bus Driver, Tony Allen. Dr. O'Malley commended Mr. Allen for his dedication to the students of the Edison Public Schools.
- Mrs. Antoinette Emden, Principal of Thomas Jefferson Middle School, informed the Board that last June, Thomas Jefferson Middle School began the task of planning for the 1:1 Chromebook initiative. The staff had varying responses to this plan. Some teachers were apprehensive and others looked forward to using technology to transport their teaching and learning. The building goal consisted of all teachers using technology to facilitate interactive, collaborative and authentic learning experiences for all learners. Mrs. Nicole Korten, a special education teacher of 17 years, took the building level goal and made it her own. With a deep level of commitment and enthusiasm, she began researching varied resources to increase her understanding of technological tools, apps and extensions that would help support, motivate and challenge her students. Her lessons included the required elements for a quality lesson (anticipatory set, purpose, modeling, guided practice, checking for understanding, etc.), but she also incorporated technology to enhance the learning of her students. Technology would be the tool she would use to light a fire under her students. Mrs. Korten's ability to crease engaging lessons that use technology in an effective manner are many, and Mrs. Emden mentioned a few showing how Mrs. Korten manages to transform teaching and learning in her classroom. Her learners are skyping and learning with classes and authors around the globe. Her students created a classroom blog featuring their writing, book talks and classroom activities. Her students created videos and podcasts of their original stories. Because of Mrs. Korten, her students have a renewed love for learning. Every day, students display pride for their work.

X. <u>COMMITTEES</u>

Finance & Facilities Committee

Dr. Heelan reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on November 10, 2015 in the Education Center.

In attendance were: Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, Mrs. Theresa E. Ward, Dr. Frank Heelan, Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Kenneth Stromsland, Kim Vierheilig and David Pereira (LAN Associates), Tony Talluto and Seth Jacobson (EPIC Management, Inc.) and Daniel Mladenovic and Roland Kekelia (Dobco Construction Company)

Discussion:

- Construction Managers reported on James Monroe Elementary School that ten days have been recouped from the 35 days Dobco was behind in the schedule for the July 15th deadline. The roof is key: being weather-sensitive, the slurry layer and lightweight concrete requires 40 degrees air temperature, and assuming warm weather, the roof would not be completed until mid-December. To achieve critical path, a water-tight temporary roof will be our contingency plan, and the permanent roof will be installed in the spring.
- New change orders are recommended for ductwork in the gym for \$60,000 and an auditorium sill detail for \$9,700. LAN Architects are negotiating with the Edison Fire Department and the Middlesex Water Company to determine the scope of the three new fire hydrants.
- Full construction permits for the additions at Menlo Park Elementary School were granted on October 28th, and excavation work commenced on October 30th. Change orders have been proposed for replacement of clay earth, and to connect a sewer pipeline to the street for a cost of \$16,000.
- The wetlands study for Woodbrook Elementary School has been submitted to the DEP for review, and we expect to receive a definite response by February 1, 2016. Drawings and permits will consume another four months, and construction is scheduled to June 2016 with a complete target of June 2017. Renovations on the multipurpose room, library and other classrooms will be effected during the summer months of 2017, so as to be ready for student occupancy by September 2017.
- The gas/diesel fueling station is power-activated, three cameras and a swipe system have been installed; and final inspection permits will be issued soon. Gas and diesel oil will be purchased through the Hunterdon Educational Services Commission Coop.
- The John P. Stevens High School gym floor has been renovated, and the Edison High School gym floor has been sanded down and varnished to a beautiful, glossy finish. Sheds have been installed in the Washington Elementary School, James Madison Primary School and the EELC School. The final installment of lockers will take place at John Adams Middle School during the Christmas break.
- The next meeting of the Finance and Facilities Committee will take place on December 9, 2015 at 9:00 A.M. in the Education Center.
