### XI. COMMITTEES

### Curriculum & Technology Committee

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar reported that the Committee met on August 25th at 8:30 AM

In attendance: Dr. Richard O'Malley, Margaret Deluca, Baninder Mahabir, Beth Moroney, Paul Distefano, Shannon Peng, Shivi-Prasad Madhukar

The Committee discussed the new teacher evaluation system. Ms. Deluca has created a 60-page manual to help with the professional development of teachers. It was discussed that no evaluations will be conducted until October. All evaluations will be done on Genesis.

Parent/student culture and climate survey is part of the Superintendent's goal for this year. As a first step, a preliminary survey has been designed for parents. The next step will be doing the same for students and teachers. The surveys will remain anonymous.

Other items included: (1) revisions to elementary curriculum guide and (2) a new math pilot to be introduced at James Monroe, Lindeneau, and Menlo Park schools called Eureka Math. Overall, about 50 classrooms across the district will be exposed to this program.

At the secondary level, revisions have been made to the 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Social Studies. Middle School Math textbooks are going to be replaced by Discovery Ed, based on the successful outcomes at Thomas Jefferson Middle School. Discovery Ed is a breakthrough digital textbook that engages students in real-world problems, while building lasting proficiency. Also part of the agenda was a new curriculum for middle school reading interventionist program for struggling readers.

High School revisions done in calculus: New textbooks will be introduced for Biology and Chemistry Honors. Algebra 1 and Geometry Honors.

PSAT will be administered on October 11, 2017 for grades 10 and 11. Grades 9 and 12 will have a delayed opening that day.

Changes have been made to the grading policy for high school. Instead of the results of the quarterlies being assigned to a non-existing "fifth" marking period, they will now constitute 10% of the grade of each of the four marking periods.

### XII. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Dr. Heelan encouraged everyone to make contributions to the Texas hurricane relief funds. He also informed the Board about the recent passing of former principal, Jerry Young, who served the district at James Monroe, Lincoln and his final 16 years at John Marshall Elementary School.

Dr. Heelan also commended Margaret DeLuca for all the progress she made in her six years in the curriculum and technology departments. He commended a student from John P. Stevens High School who participated in an exchange program to Japan for six weeks and welcomed all the new teachers who attended a recent orientation program.

Dr. Heelan encouraged everyone to attend the annual festival of marching bands at Edison High School on September 9<sup>th</sup>. In closing, he reported that the Edison Chamber of Commerce is seeking nominations for the Citizen Organization of the Year, the Young Entrepreneur of the Year, Vocational Student of the Year and Educator of the Year.

Mr. Brescher asked if all information going to the Board could be sent in a timely fashion.

Mr. Errico stated that he attended the new teacher orientation on August 21st and welcomed over 80 new employees.

Dr. Heelan also commended the teachers and supervisors for their work in putting together the new curriculum guides.

Jeff Bowden, ETEA President, discussed his concerns regarding the teacher evaluation system.

Rich Wilson, NJEA Representative, spoke about the teacher evaluation system.

Dr. Christine Miles, NJEA Representative, discussed the evaluation process.

Mike Ritsies, NJEA Representative, discussed the evaluation scoring regime.

Dr. Stefanie Hite, NJEA Representative, reviewed the evaluation rating system.

Matt Hrevnak, ETEA Vice-President, asked the Board to consider the comments of the NJEA Representatives.

Joseph Romano, resident, asked if the residents will be advised on the contents of the proposed new Superintendent's contract.

Elizabeth Conway, resident, thanked the NJEA Representatives for an excellent presentation. She also asked if there would be opioid training to the district nurses.
