I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The February 29, 2016 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Dr. Frank Heelan, at 7:00 P.M. at Lindeneau Elementary School, 50 Blossom Street, Edison, NJ.

Lindeneau Elementary School Student Council Members Akiva Lewis Allen, Holly Rizzo and Hena Patel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. ROLL CALL

Mr. Michaud took the roll, and the following members were present:

Also in attendance were Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Superintendent, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, and Mr. Jonathan Busch, Board Attorney.

III. OPENING STATEMENT

Dr. Heelan read the following opening statement:

"The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on January 7, 2016.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

IV. PRESENTATIONS

- "I Am Edison Schools" (Hidden Hero) Video Presentation Dr. O'Malley presented the video on Edison's Hidden Hero, Diane Westover, Washington School Head Secretary.
- Ms. Sara Bright, Lindeneau Elementary School Principal, welcomed everyone and informed them that she was been serving as principal since August. One of her first priorities as principal was to get to know the students. Ms. Bright spent the first few weeks of school reading aloud to classrooms. In one fifth grade class in particular, she read a story called "The Fox" and the students got into a debate about which character held the most 'power' in the book the bully, the victim or the bystander. The students were insightful, thoughtful and had unique perspectives. A few weeks later, a group of students approached her about a donation drive sponsored by Kid President called Socktober. They asked if they could get involved. Ms. Bright reported that the students organized everything from the posters, to the advertisement and collected over 1,000 pairs of socks for families in need.

In addition to this project, the students have just completed a food drive, but their generous hearts wanted to give more. Several fifth grade students set up an appointment with Ms. Bright and greeted her with their Chromebook set up with a Google Slide presentation which included critiques and suggestions for the way lunch was structured. It included a new seating chart, a reference to a student petition and inspirational quotes. While they are still working out some of the kinks, she reported, she gave the students a lot of credit for noticing something in the school they felt could be improved, creating an action plan and advocating for themselves in a mature and appropriate way.

During the month of September, Ms. Bright met with each staff member one-on-one to hear their thoughts about Lindeneau Elementary School. Each and every staff member began their meeting the same way – they shared that Lindeneau was a true community, a family, and that everyone was willing to roll up their sleeves and pitch in to make the school a powerful learning environment for the students.

Ms. Bright continued by saying this was quite true! In the beginning of the year, when she wanted to change the structure of recess to give students more choice, even though it caused some extra steps each morning for the teachers, they said no problem, because it is good for the students. When she asked a teacher to try a new research-based math technique in her classroom, she came back to the office a few days later with a stack of articles and professional books filled with post-its and highlights and said 'this is going to be so great for my kids.' Last year, when the teachers wanted to work together to see how else they could improve the school, they created a teacher-advisory committee called Voices of Lindeneau. They meet monthly to articulate, collaborate, and create an action plan to improve Lindeneau and make it a better place for all students. Ms. Bright also offered a book club about promoting student leadership, almost 100-percent of the teachers joined, giving up their free time to read and meet to discuss their students. She has never seen a group of educators so hard working – so willing to dive in and when trying something, readjust and try again,...all for the sake of the children of Lindeneau.

In closing, Ms. Bright said that in the few short months as Principal of Lindeneau Elementary School, she can see that each student has the potential to be a leader. Each student has something unique to share with the world. It may be service learning, or modeling kind behavior, exploring science through the engineering and design process or by creating the new school logo. Whatever a child's talent may be, the staff and she like to call this their 'genius.' They are committed to fostering this ability within each child to help them reach their potential.

• Ms. Bright introduced a video featuring Lindeneau Elementary School entitled "Share Your Genius," giving everyone a chance to see how the students foster this genius each day.

Dr. Heelan read aloud the following letter, which was sent to Governor Christie:

Dear Governor Christie:

Edison Public Schools has demonstrated extraordinary academic achievement. In the state standardized PARCC test, Edison had 6 of the 12 top performing schools in Middlesex County for ELA and Math 3rd and 6th grade students (See Academic Achievement – Exhibit A). High SAT and AP scores, superior ratings for the music and arts programs, characterize the outstanding achievements of our high school students.

Edison Public Schools have a severe shortage of space to educate their students (Exhibit B). To alleviate the overcrowded situation in the elementary schools, Edison taxpayers are funding the expansion of two schools, Menlo Park and Woodbrook, as well as partial funding of the James Monroe School that was catastrophically destroyed by fire.

Five-year projections for the two district high schools indicate that, according to the New Jersey State Standards for facilities, there will be a gap of 2,308 seats for students by school year 2019-2020. The overcrowding at the two schools will reach critical and unsafe dimensions.

We need help from the State of New Jersey to cope with our explosive student growth. According to the New Jersey School Funding Reform Act (SFRA), Edison Public Schools are entitled to an <u>adequacy</u> level of \$23,566,706, but the district only received \$13,781,485, a shortfall of \$9,785,221 (Exhibit C). The additional funding of nearly \$10 million would go a long way in allowing Edison School District to expand classroom space for our students, especially in the high schools. Is it not only equitable that the high achievement levels of our students would be compensated by a level of state aid that would accommodate our students with sufficient space for their learning needs?

Please consider this request seriously to bring up Edison Public Schools to state aid adequacy level.

XI. COMMITTEES

1. <u>Curriculum & Technology Committee</u> (1st of 2 Meetings)

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar reported that the Curriculum and Technology Committee met on February 1, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Ms. Margaret DeLuca, Mrs. Tara Beams, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, Mrs. Deborah Anes, Mrs. Beth Moroney and Mrs. Shivi Prasad-Madhukar

Discussion:

- Device decision for Laptops at the High School Level: Dr. O'Malley and Ms. DeLuca presented feedback from surveys conducted at the two high schools on laptops preferred by students and teachers. Student survey at the high schools indicated preference for Apple's MacBook Air. Choices included Chromebook, Microsoft Surface and MacBook. They were split between the Microsoft Surface and the MacBook.
 - Chromebook
 - Many incidents requiring technical support but the department is not very forthcoming.
 - Microsoft Surface
 - Some teachers preferred using this device, because they would write with the stylus that will show on the promethean board from anywhere in the room, rather than standing next to the board MacBook Air
 - Costs more, but it is still a lot lower than market price.
 - Potentially, students will have the ability to buy back devices at the end of 12th grade at discounted prices.
 - If students prefer not to buy them, the company will buy them back.
 - Projected to have less technical issues. In case of issues, Apple technical support works better than Chromebook.
 - There may be a learning curve as it is a different platform than Windows; but because the children will be using google classroom (which works the same way), the curve should be minimized.
 - The device will be leased and refreshed ever two years.
 - Outcome:
 - Overall, committee members were leaning towards MacBook.
 - Next Steps:
 - The District will need to go to bid for the MacBook Air, which should come with the Microsoft office software.
- Administration of PARCC at the High School Level The Committee discussed several testing
 options for PARCC for the high school level since the new format would require a minimum of 5
 days of delayed openings. Dr. O'Malley and Ms. DeLuca will talk with the NJDOE testing
 coordinator for additional information.

Next Steps: Dr. O'Malley will call NJDOE to gauge feasibility/repercussion if our district takes a different view of administering PARCC

- State of the Art Fitness Center at both High Schools
 - Ms. DeLuca reported that at Edison High School the wrestling room is being converted into a gym with state of the art fitness center. The center will be finished by March 2016. At John P. Stevens High School, three small health classrooms will be converted into a 2,500 square foot space. The construction will be completed by May 1, 2016. The room will hold 40 students at a time. Five teachers will be on duty each period.
- Elementary School Handwriting Practice
 - Mrs. Beams spoke about a new cursive writing practice book to be introduced to third graders.
 - 1. Introduction of cursive writing at the third grade level
 - 2. Students will do all the practice at home as instructed by the teachers
 - 3. There will be no instruction time spent during school hours
 - 4. It will be introduced during the third marking period
 - 5. About 90% teachers were in favor of introducing cursive writing practice. Cursive writing at the elementary level had not been a part of the curriculum for the past 10 years.
 - 6. Each book will cost the district \$10 for a total of \$10,000
- Efficacy of PARCC Results
 - Ms. DeLuca reported that the results come in one hundred days after the initial assessment. The time lag makes it difficult to use results to improve outcomes.
- 2. <u>Curriculum & Technology Committee</u> (2nd of 2 Meetings)

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar reported that the Curriculum and Technology Committee met on February 19, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Ms. Margaret DeLuca, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, Mrs. Deborah Anes, Mrs. Beth Moroney and Mrs. Shivi Prasad-Madhukar

Discussion:

- Ms. DeLuca and Dr. O'Malley provided feedback on their meeting conversation with the NJDOE official, Mr. Jeff Howard, in charge of state testing, regarding flexibility districts have in administering PARCC at the high school level.
- The Committee discussed pros and cons of testing differently than the current state regulations, but consistent with federal regulations.
- The Committee discussed possible repercussions if Edison sets a precedent by its actions. Because of legal ramifications and broader effect on the entire student population, it was agreed that the concerns of board members who are not part of the Curriculum and Technology Committee, should be taken into account.
- Ms. DeLuca and Dr. O'Malley also informed the Committee that the bids are out for MacBooks, and that leadership teams and training would be set up at both high schools to provide teachers with requisite training.

XII. <u>BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION</u>

Dr. Heelan discussed the Hatikvah School expansion.

Mrs. Moroney reported that last Saturday she was honored to be a judge at the Odyssey of the Mind competition in Oradell, New Jersey.

Mrs. Moroney and Mr. Errico thanked the schools for inviting them to read in their schools during "Read Across America" week.

Mrs. Ward mentioned that the current ESL program for adults at Lindeneau School will begin its spring session on April 4th. Adults who wish to learn or improve their English language skills are eligible for this program, which meets Monday and Wednesday evenings. As part of the program, parents are encouraged to enroll their younger children in classes given at the same time. The contact is Ginny Santoro, Supervisor of World Languages ESL at the Education Center.

Mrs. Ward also informed the Board that Ken Slusser and Ron Wahler are enrolling students for the Edison Wizards Lacrosse teams. They are planning on two teams – grades 4 through 6 and also for 7th and 8th grades. Practices start the beginning of March. For more information she asked that anyone can visit WizzardsLAX.com or contact Mr. Slusser at Lincoln School or at 848-391-9824.

In closing, she reported that the Edison High School Drama Club is presenting "Once Upon a Mattress" in the high school auditorium on March 3, 4, 5 and March 11 and 12. Showtime is 8:00 p.m. Tickets are \$10 for students and \$12 for general admission.

XIII. PUBLIC COMMENTS

A parent of a student from John Adams Middle School discussed the problems students are having using Chromebooks and the health issues that may occur while spending so much time on the computer.

A resident stated that he was unhappy with the new setup for the honors classes.

XIV. ADJOURNMENT

There being no further questions or comments forthcoming, Dr. Heelan asked for a motion to adjourn this February 29, 2016 public meeting of the Edison Board of Education at 7:54 P.M. Mrs. Moroney made the motion, seconded by Mrs. Ward and approved by all members present.
