#### I. <u>CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE</u>

The September 22, 2014 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Mrs. Veena Iyer, at 7:00 P.M. at James Monroe School, 45 Wilus Way, Iselin, NJ.

James Monroe Elementary Students, Adam Modzelewski and Angelina Javier lead the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### II. <u>ROLL CALL</u>

Mr. Michaud took the roll, and the following members were present:

Mrs. Veena Iyer, President, Dr. Frank Heelan, Vice President, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mrs. Theresa E. Ward, Mrs. Lori A. Bonderowitz, Mrs. Margot Harris, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi and Mrs. Beth Moroney. Mrs. Lora L. Fong was absent.

Also in attendance were Richard O'Malley, Ed.D, Superintendent, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Business Administrator/Board Secretary, and Mr. Jonathan Busch, Board Attorney.

#### III. OPENING STATEMENT

Mrs. Iyer read the following opening statement:

"The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on July 29, 2014.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

#### IV. JAMES MONROE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PRESENTATION – LYNDA ZAPOTICZNY, PRINCIPAL

Mrs. Zapoticzny welcomed everyone to James Monroe School. She stated that since March 22<sup>nd</sup>, she fully realized the power and magnitude of gratitude. As a community, we became closer, realized how flexible we can be and gained new insights about ourselves individually, but especially as a group. Because of what everyone has overcome, we almost believe we can leap tall buildings in a single bound!

Mrs. Zapoticzny continued by reporting that James Monroe officially opened its doors in Iselin on September 3<sup>rd</sup>, and since that time have begun to leave a footprint as a school community. The first thing that makes James Monroe unique is the fact that all the children arrive and go home on the newly purchased district buses. Because the drivers are all employed by Edison, it has been very easy to establish a rapport and discuss daily any concerns that may arise.

From day one, teachers have taken their classes on tours to establish familiarity with each floor, as well as how to navigate the staircases. Starting September 8<sup>th</sup>, each student in grades 3, 4 and 5 was assigned a chromebook and given the opportunity to navigate and explore its potential. The following day, they began to participate in district-wide benchmark assessments without ever leaving their classrooms.

At the same time, because of the 30 hard-wired computers in the school's library, and another 50 in the tech lab, the primary grade teachers breezed through the facilitation of STAR, with the assistance of our interventionists. As of tonight, Mrs. Zapoticzny stated, all of the beginning year benchmarks are complete, and the results will now inform the instructional path for every learner.

The gymnasium where the meeting is taking place tonight is any physical educator's dream, and allows the staff to involve the children in their dynamic stretching program, and a well-rounded experience in diversified sports and other physical activity to improve strength, coordination, cardio and overall well-being.

Directly underneath the gym is the cafeteria, large enough to feed all of the students at the same time, and housing a brand new state-of-the-art kitchen installed by Chartwells, the Board's food provider. This floor also provides over 1,000 square feet classrooms for Spanish, Music and Art. Because of these designated areas, classroom teachers never have to share homeroom space and are able to plan collegially, and use their prep times to the fullest advantage.

Mrs. Zapoticzny invited all to view the BTSN video, which will give the public the opportunity to see firsthand each of these floors in action.

Since arriving at the St. Cecelia's School location, everyone was made to feel very welcome. Members of the church have made sure to show everyone around and answer questions. The entire Iselin Volunteer Fire Department helped carry desks and chairs up to the top level of this building. Various officers from both Fire and Police personnel have stopped by to offer their services for assemblies and staff trainings. Corresponding Edison departments have also been in touch to determine our needs.

Last week, Mayor John McCormac visited each of our classrooms and provided every student with a free pass to the Spray Park in Fords for this past weekend. When doing some Q & A with children in each room, they were certain that they lived in Edison, but not so sure about where they went to school. The Mayor was quite clear that they were now part of Woodbridge, and he would be visiting them regularly.

There seems to be a bit of confusion on everyone's part as to just where we belong. Thinking about this predicament, Mrs. Zapoticzny believes it offers everyone the best of both worlds. What other school can say they are wanted by two such prestigious districts?

Everyone at James Monroe is in a position to embrace all of those around us, and showcase how important community is, no matter what its name, and for that we are very grateful. Because of the generosity shown James Monroe via supplies and books, our outreach to those in need with our surplus grows even larger, and puts us back on track to be the community service providers we have always been.

Since March 22<sup>nd</sup>, Mrs. Zapoticzny feels there have been a few guardian angels along the way, starting, of course, with our own Superintendent, Dr. Richard O'Malley and the Edison Board of Education members. The Diocese of Metuchen offered this spacious and architecturally solid building and through Mayor McCormac's (a St. Cecelia's graduate) divine intercession, paperwork was expedited and work began.

But from the very beginning, there was one special person watching out of all of us, and because of her offer, James Monroe stayed together and continued to be a family for the last three months of the school year. We all believe, and know that she saved us! To commemorate that special time at college, Mrs. Zapoticzny presented Dr. Joann LaPerla-Morales with a token of appreciation and reminded her that everyone at James Monroe will always be "Friends Forever, Working Together."

#### V. <u>RECOGNITION – JAMES MONROE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL</u>

Dr. O'Malley and Mrs. Iyer recognized John E. McCormac, Honorable Mayor of Woodbridge Township; Joann La Perla-Morales, President of Middlesex County College; Donald Drost, Executive Director-Facilities Management of Middlesex County College and the Most Reverend Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen for their contributions in housing the students of James Monroe Elementary School following the fire that destroyed their school building in March.

Mrs. Iyer read the following resolution:

In Appreciation of Time and Support to the James Monroe Community

- WHEREAS, the James Monroe Elementary School was destroyed by fire on March 22, 2014 leaving its 487 students in dire need of a new location to continue their education for the balance of the 2013-2014 school year, as well as the 2014-2015 and 2015-2016 school years; and
- WHEREAS, with the assistance of President Joann La Perla-Morales and Facilities Director, Donald Drost, of Middlesex County College, educational space was provided for the James Monroe students within a few days of the fire; and the college also delayed a renovation project until the end of June, in order to allow the students to complete the 2013-2014 school year at that location; and
- WHEREAS, the Edison Township Board of Education was faced with the dilemma of finding a facility for these students for a period of approximately two years until the James Monroe School was rebuilt; and
- WHEREAS, through the efforts of Woodbridge Mayor John E. McCormac, and Metuchen Roman Catholic Diocese Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski, the St. Cecelia's School in Iselin, New Jersey was made available to the James Monroe students through the 2015-2016 school year.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: that the Edison Township Board of Education sincerely thanks Joann LaPerla-Morales, Donald Drost and Middlesex County College and Mayor John E. McCormac, Bishop Paul G. Bootkoski and the Roman Catholic Diocese of Metuchen for their valiant efforts and generosity in providing the students of James Monroe School educational space in this dire time of need.

Through their efforts, the students have had the opportunity to continue their education in a quality educational facility; and the Edison School Community is eternally grateful.

#### XI. <u>COMMITTEE REPORTS</u>

1. <u>Finance & Facilities Committee</u>

Dr. Heelan reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on August 29, 2014 at James Monroe Elementary School, 45 Wilus Way, Iselin, New Jersey.

In attendance were: Dr. Frank Heelan, Mrs. Deborah A. Anes, Mr. Jingwei (Jerry) Shi, Mrs. Therese E. Ward, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mr. Daniel P. Michaud, Mr. Kenneth Stromsland, Mr. Thomas Rienzi, Mr. Frank Messineo and Ms. Alexis Goldman (Solutions Architecture) and Mr. Kenneth Karle (LAN Associates).

Discussion:

- Architect, Mr. Messineo, gave a report on summer projects:
  - Boys and girls locker room renovations at John P. Stevens High School have been completed.

• The home economics room renovations at John Adams, Thomas Jefferson and Herbert Hoover Middle Schools have been substantially finished, with the exception of Thomas Jefferson, whose room has minor floor waves that will be rectified during the winter break.

- Boiler replacement and trailers have been installed at James Madison Intermediate School.
- The handicapped chair lift at Benjamin Franklin Elementary School has been installed and permits will be issued by the start of school.
- Architect, Mr. Karle, updated the Committee on the reconstruction of James Monroe Elementary School:

• The Department of Education (DOE) approval is expected by September 25<sup>th</sup>, and then the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) will have 45 days to approve the plan.

• It is expected that footings, foundation and utilities will be ready to go to bid by the end of October; however, no bids can be issued until funds are secured.

- Various aspects of the architectural plans were reviewed, such as the code requirement for a 4,000 square foot gym, and a roof that will be sloped and not pitched.
- Architect, Mr. Rienzi, reported that the town officials in Woodbridge have issued permits approving plumbing, fire protection, roof and electric for the James Monroe School in Iselin. The Certificate of Occupancy was delivered to the District on August 29, 2014.
- Mr. Rienzi also stated that the roofing replacements at John Marshall Elementary School and John Adams and Herbert Hoover Middle Schools are 100% complete.
- Mr. Michaud informed the Committee that the eight 54-passenger busses for \$694,000 have gone on test runs to ensure that the bus drivers will be ready to transport the James Monroe Elementary School students on the first day of school
- Negotiations have been continuing between the Board's insurance company and public adjuster to reach a settlement on the total cost of replacing the destroyed James Monroe Elementary School.
- The Edison Board of Education has contracted with DAI Environmental Services to conduct an environmental audit of the proposed site for the Kilmer School. The entire Board of Education will review this report and decide on the action to be taken.
- The Committee will convene on Friday, October 10, 2014 at 9:00 A.M. in the Education Center.
