## I. CALL TO ORDER/FLAG SALUTE

The January 27, 2016 Public Meeting of the Edison Board of Education was called to order by Board President, Dr. Frank Heelan, at 7:00 P.M. at Edison High School, 50 Boulevard of Eagles, Edison, NJ.

Edison High School Senior Class President, Vivian Odubanjo, led the Pledge of Allegiance.

# III. OPENING STATEMENT

Dr. Heelan read the following opening statement:

"The New Jersey Open Public Meetings Law was enacted to insure the right of the public to have advance notice of and to attend the meetings of public bodies at which any business affecting their interests is discussed or acted upon.

In accordance with the provisions of this act, the Edison Board of Education has caused notice of this meeting to be published by having the date, time and place thereof posted in the Board of Education Administrative Offices. Copies of these notices were sent to the Home News and Tribune and the Star Ledger on January 7, 2016.

The Public may participate at regular meetings in accordance with the By-Laws and the applicable State regulations.

(Due to a snow storm/blizzard over the past weekend, the meeting scheduled for Monday, January 25, 2016 was changed to Wednesday, January 27, 2016. This was advertised on the Board's website and television station. The date change was also posted on the doors of the Education Center and Edison High School and all residents were notified of the change via a telephone call chain).

#### IV. PRESENTATIONS

- Dr. O'Malley began the evening by thanking the maintenance, grounds and custodial staff for doing an exemplary job in shoveling and plowing the school parking lots and sidewalks following this past week's snow storm, putting themselves' in harm's way, while preparing the schools for the reopening today.
- "I Am Edison Schools" (Hidden Hero) Video Presentation Dr. O'Malley presented the video on Edison's Hidden Hero, Head School Nurse Carol Martinez and commended Mrs. Martinez for all the work she does in keeping our students healthy and in a safe environment.
- Mr. Charles Ross, Principal of Edison High School, stated that he always asks, "What is great about Edison High School?". His philosophy focuses on the positive to build upon the strengths of the students. He stresses (1) Habits of Success and (2) Habits of the Mind. While students are still working on 19<sup>th</sup> Century skills, such as mastering the English Language, 21<sup>st</sup> Century skills are needed to filter all the information technology has presented to them.

Mr. Ross emphasized that "Habits of Success" do not always require a degree or certificate. Certain other habits help in all future endeavors. His rules are (1) to be on time and (2) to always do the right thing. At Edison High School the success has come forward with AP Classes, the AVID Program, the expanding STEM Academy and a staff who embraces technology.

In closing, Mr. Ross thanked the Board for the recent upgrades made to Edison High School.

# XI. <u>COMMITTEES</u>

### 1. Finance & Facilities Committee

Mr. Errico reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on January 20, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Ralph Errico, Dr. Frank Heelan, Deborah A. Anes, Theresa E. Ward, Dr. Richard O'Malley, Daniel P. Michaud, Kenneth Stromsland, Peter Pitucco, Tony Talluto (EPIC), and Ken Karle (LAN Associates)

### Discussion:

• James Monroe School reconstruction project is still running about 2 months behind schedule. Dobco, the General Contractor, will be providing, within the next week or so, their plan to make up the time in order to have the school ready for the 2016-2017 school year.

The committee reviewed a list of pending change orders that are being negotiated by the district's construction manager and architect.

The interior color selections were reviewed and approved.

Decision is expected shortly from the Department of Community Affairs regarding the installation of fire hydrants at the site.

Menlo Park School construction status was discussed along with several pending change orders
which included clay being found during the excavation. The clay needed to be removed and clean
stabilizing soil added to the construction site. The change order will be presented for approval at a
future meeting upon completion of our architect's negotiated cost.

The scheduled completion date of 7/15/16 was pushed back to 8/31/16. The board decided that if there was a chance that either addition would not be ready for September 2016, the general contractor should concentrate on the classroom addition as the priority and the gymnasium addition could be completed after September 1<sup>st</sup>.

• Woodbrook School construction, planned for the 2016-2017 school year has been on hold awaiting confirmation from the NJDEP for approval which we expect shortly.

The bid for the Woodbrook School addition is anticipated to be advertised in late spring, 2016 with completion scheduled for the opening of school in September, 2017.

- The gasoline and diesel fueling station has been completed and is currently operational. The district is anticipating a significant savings in fuel costs due to bulk fuel deliveries.
- The 2016-2017 Preliminary Budget was discussed. The district is anticipating that our state aid will be frozen, but the actual figures will not be provided until late February, 2016. Other state provided figures that are needed to prepare next year's budget are state facilities charges, charter school tuition and our SDA assessment.
- The Capital projects list of proposed building improvements for the 2016-2017 school year was reviewed.
