X. COMMITTEES

1. <u>Curriculum & Technology Committee</u>

Mrs. Prasad-Madhukar reported that the Curriculum and Technology Committee met on April 4, 2016 at the Education Center.

In attendance were: Dr. Richard O'Malley, Mrs. Tara Beams, Mrs. Margaret DeLuca, Mr. Peter Pitucco, Mrs. Beth Moroney, Mr. Jerry Shi, Mrs. Deborah Anes and Mrs. Shivi Prasad-Madhukar

Discussion:

• Mrs. Beams gave an update on the Biz World Program – A financial literacy program for 3rd graders. Students in this program undergo many real-world experiences in the business world, such as creating a product, manufacturing it (including quality control), pricing products and advertising and selling them. Recently, there have been suggestions around having this program after the major testing period is over. Mrs. Beams said there may not be enough time in the year to complete the lessons if they do not begin until after state testing, but she will look into the concern.

- Ms. DeLuca provided an update on laptops for high school students and the distribution plan. Apple MacBooks had been delivered to Edison High School and were going out to John P. Stevens High School on Monday, April 4th. These will be distributed to the students for PARCC after they bring in all the necessary paperwork. An infrastructure test for PARCC will be administered during the week of April 11th. The laptops will be taken back at the end of the testing and will be finally distributed before the beginning of the next school year, around late August. Freshmen will get them during freshmen orientation. Devices will be marked with the student's name and they will get the same device throughout their time in high school.
- There is no capacity for charging the laptops in school and students will have to charge them at home. Parent purchased insurance will not be available until the fall distribution. The District will be looking in a pricing structure, but they hope to keep it in the \$50/\$60 range.
- Teacher Leadership Teams from both high schools have already received one day of training. In all, there were 20 teachers from Edison High School and 15 teachers from John P. Stevens High School. During the week of April 25th, all teachers will get the new devices and they will begin their training in May. Teachers will be provided professional development opportunities throughout the summer. They will also have access to the Apple Store training one day of the week.
- Summer School -
 - Summer School failure and credit recovery will be offered at both high schools. This will utilize an on-line program under teacher supervision.
 - Accelerated courses on Java and Pre-Calc will be offered at John P. Stevens High School, but open to eligible students from both high schools. These are full-year courses taught by District math teachers. To be eligible, students must have completed prerequisites in good standing.
 - 5th and 6th Grade Pilot Math Project: In order to increase the opportunity for more students to be placed in Accelerated Math, a new pilot project will be introduced this year that will allow an estimated 120 students to improve their math skills through a 6-week blended learning class, which will allow teachers to push personalized assignments through Tenmarks and to monitor student progress. These students will then be tested before the beginning of the next school year. If they are able to successfully pass the test, they will be moved from their initial Academic placement into Accelerated.
 - Update on the AVID Program: 70% of the students were accepted into a four-year college program.
 - Tech Interns: Six full-time paid tech-intern positions will be introduced over the summer. Six students (currently Juniors or Seniors) will be hired to assist in the District's technological department. Three students each will be hired from John P. Stevens and Edison High Schools.

XI. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mrs. Bonderowitz explained why she voted no on the Ratification of the EPSCMA Collective Bargaining Agreement and commended the members for taking a salary freeze a few years ago.

Mr. Shi and Mr. Iyer explained that they voted no because they needed more time to review the EPSCMA contract.
