

Overall purpose of the program:



 To earn an Associate Degree while attending high school. Graduate high school with a high school diploma and a Middlesex College Associate Degree.

To save money



Who should enroll in this program:

- Every student who plans to attend Middlesex College
- Every student who wants to get a head start on their college
- education
- Every student who plans to continue their education at a four year school
- Every student who plans to continue their education to receive a Master's degree
- Every student who is not sure whether or not to continue their education

To earn an Associate Degree, students must successfully complete 20 courses.

Earn an Associate Degree = only \$2500

Requirements:

- Student must inform the school counselor of intent to participate in the program.
- Student must register with Middlesex College by the due date.
- Family must pay Middlesex College directly.
- Once student registers for a course, the student <u>must</u> pay for the course...even if they decide to drop the course.
- In order to receive credit for the course, the student must register for the MC credit
 before taking the course. Payment must be made before receiving credit.
- Courses worth 6 credits require applications and payment for both semesters.
- Student must take 15 credits (of intended program) at Middlesex College.
 - Students (age 15) may take evening, weekend or summer classes.
 - These courses will not appear on the high school transcript.
- Students must earn at least a "C" grade to earn MC credit.
 - o Only courses (and grades) offered by the high schools will be included on the high school transcript.
 - All grades from the ECP will be included on the MC transcript.
- Student must check email regularly.



Edison Courses/ Edison Teachers/ Edison Credit/ MC Credit

Every high school student must earn 130 credits to graduate high school.

For the ECP Program...

Students must take an additional 15 credits from MC

- Some classes will be on campus (after school, weekends, summer)
- Some classes may be offered at EHS and JPS
- Some classes may be offered online/virtually
- Some classes may count toward the 130 high school graduation requirement

AP Courses

Advanced Placement is a program created by the College Board which offers college-level curricula and examinations to high school students. American colleges and universities <u>may</u> grant placement and course credit to students who obtain high scores (3, 4, 5) on the examinations.

Edison Public Schools offer 25 AP courses

Middlesex College accepts AP exam scores of 3 or higher for college credit. The student must be enrolled in the course. There is no cost for the course; however, there is a cost for the exam.

Start with these courses:

9th Grade: World Language



10th Grade: World Language

or

US History II

Public Speaking

Sociology (S)



Please note: Middlesex College participates in the CCOG ---Community College Opportunity Grant. Families with an income of 65K or less are eligible for the grant. The grant allows students to earn up to 18 credits per semester for free. However, students who are in a dual enrollment program while still in high school are not eligible for the CCOG. CCOG recipients must be matriculated county college students who have earned a high school diploma or GED.
