#### X. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Dr. Heelan reported that he attended a meeting of the Educational Services Commission of New Jersey. Discussed at that meeting were the following: (1) There was a program on the transition to adult programs for students with special needs. At 21 years, he reported, the students are "handed over to their parents". The State has provided a great deal of finances and there are many private groups popping up, as well. There is also a good deal of money coming through the Department of Developmental Disabilities and from Social Security and Medicaid for formalized programs with busing on the side; and (2) the Bright Beginnings School in Piscataway is proposing to add an addition to the school.

Dr. Heelan thanked Board Member, Veena Iyer, who could not be present for her last Board Meeting, for being part of the revolutionary group of board members who started to make great changes in the Board. She served six years and also served as President of the Board. In closing, Dr. Heelan wished everyone a Happy Holiday Season.

Mr. Errico reported that he attended the new James Monroe School Open House and thanked the Board and Administration who saw this project through the last two years. He thanked Mrs. Bonderowitz for serving as a board member the last six years. In closing, Mr. Errico wished everyone a happy holiday season and safe new year.

Mrs. Ward reported that it had been six interesting years since she met, ran with and began serving with Board Member, Lori Bonderowitz. They have seen and experienced much that would not have happened if Gene Maeroff had not had the insight or foresight to put faith in everyone on the Board. She told Mrs. Bonderowitz that she did her job under some genuinely trying family and work situations and said she smiled on Saturday when she read the plaque at the new James Monroe School and realized that Mrs. Bonderowitz is enshrined there for posterity. What a way to go out! She mentioned that her mother used to say, "You just have to live long enough" and wished Mrs. Bonderowitz many long years in health and prosperity.

Mrs. Ward spoke excitedly about the open house at the new James Monroe Elementary School. She said that our school leaders in the endeavor, naming Dr. O'Malley, Mr. Michaud and Mr. Busch, deserve the lion's share of the credit for 2 ½ years of constancy. They should be most proud! However, behind the scenes were employees at every level who did what they had to do to and did it well at record speed and cost. She said that if she started to name names the error of omission could be egregious. The people of Edison Township should know what wonderful employees the Board has and be most appreciative.

Mrs. Ward spoke of two people outside of Edison Township who voluntarily and unceremoniously stepped up to the plate at strategic points and facilitated the two critical transitions. Those two are Joann LaPerla-Morales, president of Middlesex County College, who within 12 hours of the disaster offered the college facilities and then proceeded to follow through for the two months the students were there. Also, John McCormac, Mayor of Woodbridge Township, who was paramount in brokering the terms for the Iselin school. The relief they brought is incalculable and the Edison Board of Education is indebted to both of them for their help.

Following up on a request she received a few months ago and having experienced the traffic problems in and around the James Monroe School on Saturday, Mrs. Ward believes the Board should consider requesting that the Edison Police Department make the lower ends of Harmon Road and Hallo Street one way during peak school traffic hours.

She also mentioned that James Madison Primary School held its annual winter concert on Friday and Miss McCarroll and the  $2^{nd}$  grade teachers directed the children in a musical program that was a visual and choreographic delight.

In closing, Mrs. Ward informed everyone that every year the Terra Nova Garden Club sponsors a Wreathes Across America program during which they honor veterans as far back as the French and Indian War. This event is held at the Piscatawaytown Burial Ground on Woodbridge Avenue in Edison. The graves are marked and the public is invited to place the wreathes on these graves after a most impressive military ceremony which lasts about one-half hour. The date and time is Tuesday, December 27<sup>th</sup> at noon.

Mrs. Bonderowitz stated that this is her last opportunity to speak as a board member. She thanked the residents of Edison and commended the former board members, under the leadership of President, Gene Maeroff, and the present board members for serving with her on the Board. Mrs. Bonderowitz also thanked Daniel Michaud, BA/BS and his secretary, Judi Cox, for all they do to assist the Board and thanked Dr. O'Malley for being a great leader. She thanked the present Board for their professionalism and encouraged the residents of Edison to pay attention and get involved.

Dr. Heelan commended Mrs. Bonderowitz for all her contributions to the Board over the last six years.

Mrs. Moroney reported that there was a large crowd who attended the open house at the new James Monroe Elementary School on Saturday despite the horrible weather. She also commended James Madison Intermediate School student, Casey Decker for an incredible job singing the Star Spangled Banner.

#### XI. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Matt Hrevnak, ETEA 1<sup>st</sup> Vice-President, commended a former John P. Stevens High School student for his independent film regarding special needs students, which was presented at a film festival in Red Bank.

Elizabeth Conway, resident, questioned tuition grievances and the commended the Board on the new Menlo Park Elementary School gymnasium.
