Items Discussed:

- The Committee watched a six minute video done in support of the Fort Lee Referendum. The video was succinct, but got the message out.
- Power Point both the video and Power Point could be put on the Internet for viewing. We could do sound bites for other media (i.e. Facebook).
- In the video, we would have to get recognizable people from the District to speak.
- Mr. Saxton would like to use the Power Point that Mrs. Perantoni put together for the board meeting in May for viewing on the website.
- Presentation Teams will go out to one of four designated sites to go over the details of the Referendum. Mr. Errico suggested that a board member attend each presentation.
- Two band concerts are planned for this summer (August 24). Chartwells is donating hot dogs and drinks to educate parents on the details of the Referendum.
- Mr. Bowden suggested that we attempt to help unregistered voters get registered before the Referendum date. Students are willing to help with this. Ms. Pawlikowski said that forms are distributed in Social Studies classes for students to register if they are of age.
- Talking Points Right now Mr. Saxton has about 30 talking points which need to be honed down.
- Mrs. Gulick and Mrs. Moroney agreed to refine the talking points.
- Mr. Kissane will also contact police and fire departments.
- Mr. Kissane will be talking to the VFW, teachers and Mr. Bowden. Each principal should create a phone chain of parents.
- Mr. Kissane suggested that we reach out to former students who are "famous", such as Mark Polanski (Astronaut) and Susan Sarandon (Actress) as well as Hall of Honor inductees.
- Presidents of the PTA/PTOs should be brought into a meeting before the end of the year.
- Mr. Saxton suggested ordering large buttons that say "24" on them to generate discussion on the date of the Referendum.
- The Committee watched the video of the overcrowding in the schools, videoed by Mr. McDonald, which was very compelling.
- Mr. Saxton is going to contact the PTA/PTO Presidents to get a meeting set up.

The meeting adjourned at 5:00 P.M.

3. Finance & Facilities Committee

Mr. Brescher reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met on May 28, 2019 at 4:00 P.M. in the Education Center, 312 Pierson Avenue, Edison, NJ 08837.

In attendance were: Jingwei "Jerry" Shi, Richard Brescher, Dr. Yunxia "Yuna" Chen, Paul J. Saxton, Daniel P. Michaud, Richard Pepe, Ken Taylor, Christopher Conklin, Patrick Kissane and Ralph Barca

Items Discussed:

- Mr. Conklin presented a proposal for 5 additional registered nurses to be stationed at the elementary schools that exceed a 700 student enrollment that currently have one nurse.
- Mr. Barca presented 3 server options for the handling of the Genesis application when the district converts the financial software to Genesis. The most cost effective option is to purchase a server and provide onsite support as opposed to a hosted solution.
- Mr. Barca is concerned about the turnover of the district technicians. Neighboring districts are hiring them away from us after they are trained because they pay higher salaries. Mr. Barca proposes not hiring an additional tech and provide increased salaries to the existing staff.
- Mr. Kissane presented a sidebar agreement for the ETEA non-certified contract in which the district could opt for some of the current 12 month security guard positions to become 10 month positions.
- Scott Mihalick from SSP Architects presented the process for power purchase agreement (PPA) solar projects which would include 3 professional firms. The Committee requested that the district forward the sample specifications to the board attorney to see if the district would be able to legally enter into a PPA by bidding the project on its own.
- Mr. Taylor presented a proposal submitted by the BAPS Temple on Woodbridge Avenue by Benjamin Franklin School in which roadway improvements, including traffic control lights and turning lanes, would be installed at no cost to the board. There has been a request to install a 4 foot chain linked fence in front of Benjamin Franklin School at no cost to the board. The Committee is requesting that the fence be an aluminum picket fence for a better appearance of the school.
- Mr. Taylor discussed a proposal submitted by Chartwells to make improvements to the kitchen of Washington School which would alleviate the need to serve the students' lunches in the hallway. The project cost is \$129,788 and would use part of the \$500,000 investment that Chartwells pledges with their food service proposal. The Committee approved the project.
- The Committee reviewed the Superintendent's recommendations for the 2019-2020 exempt salaries and after making a few modifications, approved the listed salaries.

The meeting adjourned at 5:50 P.M.

XI. BOARD MEMBERS – OPEN DISCUSSION

Mr. Brescher thanked the Curriculum Committee for making the technology modifications. He also commended the Arts Departments in the Edison Schools and congratulated Ms. Mallon at John Adams Middle School for presenting the play Shrek the Musical and getting all the students involved in the production.

Mrs. Ward spoke about Lindeneau School Leadership Day. She also read the following statement regarding the Shared Services Agreement:

RE: Shared Services Agreement

"At the April 15 Public Meeting the Board voted to approve the Shared Services Agreement between the Township of Edison and the Board of Education. The Agreement had been presented to us for the first time in January as a fait accompli. Between mid-January and the April 15 meeting the full board had never met to discuss the terms, pro and con, of the Agreement. My concerns were many and I expressed them at the meeting. The following facts are an update:

There are members of the board who have dual allegiances and would have done well to have recused themselves when the vote was taken.

As a means of securing our consent, we were assured in January that the Agreement would only be for the 2018-19 school year and that, come July 1, 2019 the township would take over and assume the costs.

SLEO III's and Security:

The 20 SLEO III's (up from 12, 15 & 18) mentioned in the contract are nowhere near. Last count the Edison Police Department had three. If the Edison Police Department has to hire part-time SLEOs to enhance the numbers, that would double the cost to the board for equipping and training. Be mindful, all costs are accompanied by a 10% payment to the township and 18.53% payment for salaries to the township and their 3^{rd} and now 4^{th} parties.

All 26 of our security personnel will be state certified and, per Mr. Kissane, he is providing ongoing appropriate training for administrators, faculty and students. Additional armed security in the schools, previously approved by this board, is still on the table.

Except for 2 schools, all double locks on classroom doors are installed and the 2 remaining schools will have them by the end of the school year.

Radios:

All of our buildings currently have 2 emergency buttons each with instant contact to the Edison Police Department. State-mandated panic alarms that the legislature agreed would be paid for with the \$500 million bond issue passed in November and a state revenue windfall of \$377 million should be available if needed.

The police radios (those still not functioning when we signed the Agreement in April), although a good backup, need not be a priority as Mr. Kissane has an alternative plan for all personnel to have instant response to an invasion or emergency by September.

Automobiles:

The Board of Education owns no cars for personal use – only maintenance vehicles and one delivery van. The Board of Education should not be obligated to violate its own policy by purchasing cars for the police. The township, however, does own its own fleet of at least 44 autos, a van and a truck and, if the Edison Police Department needs extra cars to provide 24-7 protection for the citizens of Edison, it might do well to look inward.

Salaries:

Paying the police through the township, Edison Police Department, and a third party – now it's a fourth party; add Seacoast Business Funding in North Carolina to Extra Duty solutions in Connecticut – and adding 18.53% to the salaries not agreed upon by us is out of line. The police person does not receive that 18.53%. The township and the out-of-town corporations do. We always have and should continue to directly hire and pay for police security at our games. Presently, terms for athletic events are egregious - \$58.88 per hour with a 3-hour minimum; that's a \$176.64 obligation for openers. This has been reduced from a 4-hour minimum + \$5 for travel.

Agreement Costs:

There is no way we can control costs. All facets of the Agreement are open ended and none is contracted or negotiated by the Board of Education. The Agreement costs started out in January at \$1.3 million, reduced, after Mr. Kissane entered the talks, to \$800,000 with some shavings, and subsequently brought back up to \$1 million event with the shavings:

Currently the Agreement reads: \$200,000 escrow which must be maintained; \$1,000,000 cost listed on the Agreement; \$2,208 for upgrade of police radio tower, and \$1,500 to implement a cradle point rotator – bringing the total to \$1,208,708 which is pretty near the original \$1.3 million.

Recently, a newspaper headline quoted a township partisan claiming the Board of Education would save hundreds of thousands of dollars under this Agreement and with no explanation. I don't know how the person arrived at that figure but it made the township look like it was doing us a vast service. We are the cash cow and they make no bones about it.

In none of the terms of the Agreement is the township accountable for any lapses. It is peppered with escape terms such as "make a reasonable attempt;" "provide adequate" whatever, and relying on "availability." None of the terms is defined. If the number of SLEOs does not meet the 20 in the contract, the schools will do without security and it will just have to be OK. They are not answerable to anyone. There is not a scintilla of evidence that our students and staff are safer under this Agreement than under our former plan which, by the way, has never been rescinded.

The Bottom Line here is that none of the facets of the Agreement is sufficiently developed, workable or even necessary. The 20 SLEOs will provide an average of 4 hours per school day per school; and when we subtract the half-hour from the Edison Police Department at the beginning to the shift and a half-hour back to the Edison Police Department at the end of the shift, we will have just 3 hours per school per day. We can hire and train our own security, arrange our own contracts on our terms, and maintain our ability to handle the security issues in the schools. The security agreement with the Edison Police Department which was in place before the Shared Services Agreement was introduced in January is a sane, efficient, affordable and practical response in which there are clean lines of responsibility and authority. That agreement has never been rescinded; it is still viable.

A most significant fact is that after their having received our signatures on the Agreement two months ago, we had not, as of our caucus meeting last Wednesday, received the Agreement with the township signatures. The signed Agreement reached us after I called it to the attention of the board and an assumed rush to action ensued. This is a sign to us of their laxness.

I am, therefore, again suggesting to this board that we rescind the Shared Services Agreement while we are still ahead and are not saddled with radio towers, cars, contracts, and costs not beneficial to our security.

Mr. Shi, I am now making a motion that the Board of Education rescinds the Shared Services Agreement."

Mrs. Ward made a motion to rescind the SLEO Agreement, seconded by Mrs. Conway.

Mr. Shi informed Mrs. Ward that because the agreement was signed by both entities, it is an active contract. It cannot be rescinded; however, we could initiate the 30-day clause to terminate the agreement.

Mrs. Conway spoke about the James Madison Intermediate School flag Day Ceremony.

Mrs. Patel reported on Law Day held at Edison and John P. Stevens High Schools on June 6th.

XII. <u>PUBLIC COMMENTS</u>

Anthony DeAmorin, resident, questioned the alternative plan for SLEO and the modular classrooms in the FD Roosevelt Building.

Joseph Johnson, resident, spoke about the Youth Civics Council and the Lena Harris Foundation.

Bill Brunner, resident, questioned tuitions and class sizes.

A resident spoke about students helping the elderly and disabled, suggesting they receive PE credit for this service.

Matt Hrevnak, ETEA Vice-President, questioned the open administration positions, asking if there will be a special meeting in July to hire these individuals.

A resident questioned the athletic fields and after school transportation.

XIII. <u>ADJOURNMENT</u>

There being no further questions or comments forthcoming, Mr. Shi asked for a motion to adjourn this June 17, 2019 public meeting of the Edison Board of Education at 9:12 P.M. Mr. Errico made the motion, seconded by Dr. Chen and approved by all members present.
