Mrs. Contaldi and Mr. Michaud reviewed all resolutions prior to the Board vote.

Mrs. Contaldi reported on the preparation for the Opening of Schools. She also reported that the Board Committees have been working diligently with the Board Attorney to review and comment on the need for several sidebar agreements. The Board is being asked to consider two settlement agreements which are in the best interest of the District. A resolution will be considered by the Board to terminate an agreement so that receptacles can be removed from board of education property. The Board will contemplate approving the YMCA contracts for high school students to participate in swim teams and is being asked to approve a change in schedule on October 16, 2019 for a 3 hour delayed opening at both high schools for Freshmen and Senior students to ensure that a proper testing environment exists for Sophomores and Juniors to take the PSAT. There is a proposal to administer the PSAT 8/9 to all Grade 8 students in December 2019 in order to measure what students have already learned, which shows them whether they are on track for college, and lets them know where they need the most improvement; scores will be reported to parents and used as part of the grouping procedure criteria for the 2020-2021 school year. As mandated annually to ensure teacher effectiveness, members of the ScIP Panel for every school need Board approval. The Board needs to approve the evaluation rubric and teacher practice instrument for teaching staff members. There are not changes to the rubric or instrument from last year.

There are curriculum guides for the 2019-2020 school year inclusive of summer revisions, two FCCLA field trips and documentation for two out of district events to be approved this month. Several terminated placements, change of placement, returned to district and new placements of students to be approved in the Out of District Placements report; and additional services for homebound students, as well as assistive technology and communication services for students in need.

Mr. Michaud reported on the finance resolutions to be approved by the Board.

1. <u>Finance & Facilities Committee</u>

Mr. Brescher reported that the Finance and Facilities Committee met at 4:00 P.M. on August 20, 2019 at the Education Center, 312 Pierson Avenue, Edison, NJ 08837.

In attendance were: Richard Brescher, Jingwei "Jerry" Shi, Ralph Errico, Margaret Contaldi, Daniel Michaud, Richard Pepe and Ken Taylor

Items Discussed:

- Mr. Pete Campisano and Ms. Tara Dohoney, from USA Architects, provided a status report of the FDR Modular Classroom Addition. Due to several delays, including the issuance of the permits and remediating unsuitable soil, the estimated completion date has been changed to October of 2019. Mr. Conklin has a contingency plan in place to service these students until the completion of the ten classroom addition. USA Architects presented a change order for \$33,956 which included charges and credits to the original specifications.
- Ms. Alesha Peluso from Three Summers Creative provided the Committee with ideas for information sharing services to help inform the public of the details about the December 10th Referendum.
- Mr. Marcus Rosenau and Mr. Jack Wengrzynek, from SSP Architects, gave the Committee a status report for the Woodrow Wilson Middle School modular classroom project. The project is progressing well and is still anticipated to be ready by 9/1/19. They presented change orders for \$37,775 representing several changes that were necessary due to unforeseen field conditions.
- Mr. Perry DiPezzi, from Field Turf USA, Inc., presented a revised proposal for the design and installation of a turf baseball field at Edison High School. The revised proposal reduced the engineering fee by \$12,000. After reviewing the sketches and the proposal, the Committee is recommending that the Board approve the project. The District will transfer funding from the capital reserve account to cover the cost of this project.
- The Committee reviewed the status report that was provided by the District's roofing architect, Tom Rienzi, for the roofing projects at four district schools. The Edison High School roof is completed and the other three will be completed prior to the start of the school year.
- Mr. Taylor provided a status report of the projects that are being completed during the summer of 2019. Most of the summer projects have been completed and the balance of the projects will either be completed before school begins or will be completed shortly afterward.
- The Committee reviewed the construction manager job description and after a few minor modifications, is being recommended for approval at the next board meeting.
- The Committee reviewed three proposed sidebar agreements for the ETEA contract. One for salary guide credit for hard to fill certified positions, one for armed security guards and one for a Wingman program club stipend.
